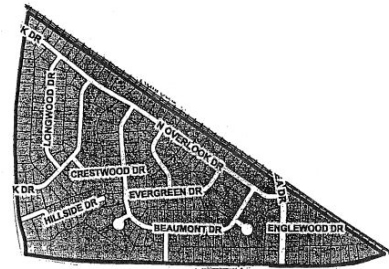

City Spring Clean Up

Saturday April 24th

Each Spring the City sponsors a Spring Clean Up during which residents may put at the curb items not routinely picked up by the City Sanitation vehicles. This is a great opportunity to get rid of those items hanging around your home or shed. This year's Spring Clean up is April 24th. Among other things, the city will pick up tires, batteries, old kitchen appliances, and furniture. However building materials, toilets, old carpet, liquid paint (take covers off now to let it dry), or pesticides will not be picked up. Keep in mind that yard waste must always be piled separately from all other waste in order to be picked up. Check out the City Sanitation website for more information. Safety First!

Unfortunately our neighborhood has not been completely immune from the kinds of crime facing the City. Please ensure your personal safety and the safety of your possessions by:

- *locking your doors even when you are home
- *keeping valuables out of sight in your vehicle
- *breaking up boxes from large purchases before putting them at the curb
- *locking your car doors
- *letting neighbors and the police know when you will be out of town. Call 329-4317 to arrange a house check.
- *have your mail picked up or stopped while you are out of town

The EENA encourages all residents to be alert and contact the Police if they notice anything of concern in the neighborhood. Better safe than sorry!

*House Number Ordinance

A new city ordinance requires that all houses have 4 inch numbers that are visible to the street. This is to facilitate quick response in the case of an emergency.

*Animal Ordinances

It's that wonderful time of year when both people and animals enjoy the outdoors. Please keep in mind the city ordinance to keep your dogs on a leash when not confined with a fence in your yard. And, to keep all of our yards beautiful, please "scoop the poop". ☺
